## **Annual Reports**

National office has sent out the instructions for the annual reports with the fall mailing.

- A) **On-line reporting** has been available since November 1, 2018 and the deadline if you wish to do it on-line is January 15, 2019.
- B) If your parish wishes to do the **reports on paper**, instructions are included in the memo in the mailing, but the deadline for paper reports would be December 15, 2018 to allow time for them to be converted for inclusion in electronic reports.
