Each of you has been gifted with a special talent. Every person around the world has a talent...no matter how large or small. Allow them to be a part of this great organization, to bring their gifts and talents to the table.

As I have promised over the years and will again formally at the Installation Mass this afternoon, "I will with God's help". Today, I will extend it to include all of you, trying as one by one to make a difference, and then all of us working together to magnify that difference. Can I count on you?

By keeping these three words in mind, Educate – Engage – Empower as we collaborate and develop strategies to bring us into the future, God's grace will guide us through the journey -- whether it be a few short steps or a long and winding road. We cannot do it on our own; we must re-charge spiritually so that we can feed His Lambs, tend His sheep and love our neighbours.

As we put our vision and dreams on paper, there are two things I am sure will help us succeed: Faith and a spirit of gratitude, and that means even being grateful for the bad days. We have a winning combination when we can leverage God's purpose on our lives and use it to serve others.
