A Speech for 2018 Convention

Inspired/Guided by the Holy Spirit, how have I responded to God's call in my position as Spiritual Development Chair?

The Holy Spirit guided me even before becoming the Spiritual Development Chair of the London Diocesan Council. I had originally decided not to put my name forward to go onto the council and prayed to the Holy Spirit to guide me in what He wanted for me. The many women in the Catholic Women's League – the diocesan executive as well as the ladies of the parish councils that have hosted Lenten Retreats, Days at Our Lady of the Rosary Shrine, Fall Regional days, etc. have been willing to share their gifts and experiences and in turn helped me to grow in my relationship with God Their faith and joy in the Lord shines through. I say thank you to all of you.

I would especially like to thank Jackie Detailleur, a member of St. Benedict's Council in Sarnia for agreeing to be on the Book of Life sub committee. She has done an exemplary job in looking after it. That has given me the time to concentrate on the other requirements of this position.

During this time I have gained confidence in what I am capable of accomplishing, acquired additional organization skills as well as oral and written skills. It has been a wonderful learning experience for me. In conclusion, I would like to share this prayer with you.
